Volunteering is a priority of the European Union.

More and more opportunities to volunteer are now available, some with financial support through flagship EU programmes such as the **European Solidarity Corps.** As you will see, this programme offers various options to volunteer abroad.

VOLUNTEERING PROJECTS WITH THE EUROPEAN SOLIDARITY CORPS

The European Solidarity Corps is an EU programme that supports international volunteering projects in a broad range of fields, including sustainable development.

You will receive financial support for travel and subsistence costs, pocket money, complementary insurance, and support services such as language support and training. Costs related to specific needs (for example, disability) can also be covered.



HUMANITARIAN AID

The European Voluntary Humanitarian Aid Corps of the European Solidarity Corps offers volunteering opportunities to strengthen local capacity and improve the resilience of disaster-affected communities.

You will receive financial support for travel and accommodation, pocket money and exceptional costs such as visa and other expenses such as vaccination insurance.

There is a high demand for this programme, so please be aware that not all candidates will be selected.

Legally reside in an EU Member State or in a third country associated with the programme

INTERREG VOLUNTEER YOUTH

Interreg Volunteer Youth is an EU programme for young people eager to gain new international experiences and have an impact through volunteering by supporting solidarity actions between EU regions.

Projects support European cooperation across borders in various fields such as environmental protection.

Volunteers receive financial support to cover expenses for food and accommodation, and a contribution to travel costs and insurance.

GREENPEACE

If your main concern is climate change and the environment, volunteering with Greenpeace may be the right choice for you. You will join more than 15,000 volunteers across the globe committed to fight for a greener future and carrying out a huge variety of tasks, from painting signs and organising local marches to dropping banners and occupying oil rigs or campaigning on social media to advance advocacy and raise awareness.

There are many ways to get involved with Greenpeace, such as helping them share their campaigns on social media or volunteering.



Volunteering opportunities differ from country to country, So contact the Greenpeace office in your country for detailed information.





WORLD WIDE FUND FOR NATURE

WWF offers between 30 to 35 years old volunteering opportunities (between 3 to 6 months) either online or in locations like Bolivia, Madagascar, the Pacific, the Carpathians. You could also volunteer at WWF International, where the organisation pursues safeguarding the natural world-oceans, forests, freshwater and rich diversity of wildlife while tackling climate change and food production problems.

Be aware you may need to cover your stay.





WORLD WIDE OPPORTUNITIES ON ORGANIC FARMS

WWOOF is a worldwide movement linking volunteers with organic farmers and growers to promote cultural and educational experiences based on trust and non-monetary exchange, helping build a sustainable, global community.

The tasks depend on the project, location and host with whom you will agree on a duration that fits the two of you. Projects usually range from **one to two weeks**, though some may be as short as 2 or 3 days or as long as 6 months.

Hosts provide food, accommodation and opportunities to learn new skills.

How to get started?

Sign up as a volunteer on the WWOOF Organisation in charge of the country you want to visit. Contact the hosts to arrange your visit. A complete list of all destinations is available on the website.



EU BEACH CLEAN UP

Every year, the European Union, in partnership with the United Nations and the Smurfs, organises an oceanactivism and awarenessraising campaign **#EUBeachCleanup** featuring beach, river banks and various cleanup events across the world.

The **World Cleanup Day** is usually in September.
